In a press release on Friday, The National Right to Life Committee (NRLC) decried the CDC's funding, which was awarded last fall to a team at RTI International, a company which does contract work for the government. The team is working on a so-called "Trojan horse" vaccine—one that can be given to pregnant women who are exposed to Zika without their consent. This is the same kind of vaccine the CDC is working on for Ebola. "The National Right to Life Committee, working with local partners across the country, will launch the 'Make It Home Again' campaign this week in response to CDC's proposed use of RU-486 to treat women who may be exposed to the sexually transmitted virus," the release states. "This dangerous plan should not have proceeded, and the CDC must stop all research on this dangerous drug until full-scale safety tests are conducted." "The use of RU-486 to bring about abortion in the case of an embryonic Zika infection is a terribly dangerous plan—and it's especially ironic for the CDC, which has launched this Trojan horse vaccine program for the Ebola virus," said Jim Sedlak, the NRLC's senior lobbyist. "Following in the footsteps of the FDA and WHO, the CDC is
